Moiya Stubbs researched the history of the Stubbs family documenting their presence in America since 1695.


Jane Stubbs Baily documented that Richard and Johanna are the parents of Thomas as well as the early family history involving Thomas Stubbs.

Thomas Stubbs (b.1695-98) acquired title to land in Chowan County, NC in 1721, when he married Mary Everett. The land was a gift to Mary from her

father Nathanial Everett. Upon her marriage to Thomas Stubbs, the land transferred to his name.

The land is located in Chowan County, north of Beaufort and Hyde County, surrounding the Albemarle Sound (Figure 1)ⁱ

Thomas and Mary died in Beaufort County, NC in January and August 1738 respectively.



Thomas and Mary Everett had five sons according Figure 1 Chowan County, NC., in 1721 to the probate record. Thomas and all of the sons were able to read and write. Thomas and all of his children were born and died in NC.

Will and probate records allocated the Thomas Stubbs properties as follows:

- William 1721-1795 Age 17 "My manor plantation lying near Moratock Bridge."
- Thomas 1723-1801 Age 15 "Plantation at Flat Swamp on Pantico Road."
- John 1725-1790 Age 13 "Land on Coneke Creek called Briles Neck."
- Richard 1727-1754 Age 11 "Land known as Saverges."




Figure 2 Tyrrell County, NC., in 1738

The lands owned by the younger family members were held in trust by Nathanial Everett, Mary's father.

Although Thomas and Mary Stubbs died in Beaufort County, NC., their land holdings were in Tyrrell County along Pantico Road that was located above the flood plains of Kendrick and Coneke Creeks prominent features in today's Washington County, NC. Rodney Stubbs, his siblings and children are descendent of Everett Stubbs 1729-1793. Following the death of Everett, an advertisement in a Newbern newspaper on April 3, 1794, where the location of the Everett Plantation is clearly defined, Figure 3.

From the will of Richard Stubbs who granted his land to Everett we can define the location of Saverges land located along Beaver Dam Creek that was added to the Everett Plantation contains a total of 1,100 acres. TO BE SOLD, A PLANTATION in Tyrrel Court within a mile of Mackey's ferr whereon Everit Stubbs lately lived, as taining upwards of eleven hundred acre of which a part is cleared. The terr are forty *fhillings per acre*, one half at the remainder in one year, with approve fecurity. Any application by poft will attended to. THOMAS POLLOK.

An 1818 Survey enabled plotting the alignment of the Pamlico Road from Mackey to Roper thence from Roper past the Morratock Primitive Baptist Church (1798 - 1956) on Morratock Road referenced in Thomas Stubbs (1698-1738) probate record The alignment was prior to the establishment of Plymouth, NC; and current flood plain maps for Washington County, NC thence south along Long Acre Road to the Flat Swamp. This road is lined with cemeteries and leads to Pinetown and beyond to Bath, NC. The following chart outlines 12 Generations of the Everett-Stubbs (1729-1793) family that began with Richard (1698-1711) The family has resided in North America for 302 years. Based on Paternal Y-DNA testing and historical records.

Jesse Stubbs, son of Everett, left North Carolina and moved to Roane, TN likely a part of the Blount family movement west, where George S Stubbs was born and raised a very large family consisting of 14 children. Jason Stubbs migrated to Illinois and settled in Black Hawk County, Iowa taking advantage of land grants offered to early settlers. His son William H Stubbs migrated to Furnas County, Nebraska. Bertie Stubbs b. 1881 migrated to Canada, returned to Furnas County, Nebraska to farm. During the Depression, Bertie migrated to Thurston, Washington then to Albany, Oregon.

Bertie's son Dale M. Stubbs migrated to Colorado where he met his second wife Rubie A. Bergman. After their marriage, they migrated to Santa Monica, California where Dale was hired by Douglas Aircraft Company to build DC-3s and DC-6 airplanes for passenger and military service. Rodney Stubbs, son of Dale and Rubie was born in 1941 in Los Angeles, California.

Dale and his family migrated to Oregon where three generations now reside.
